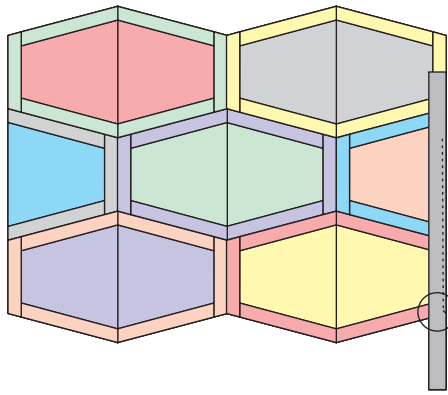
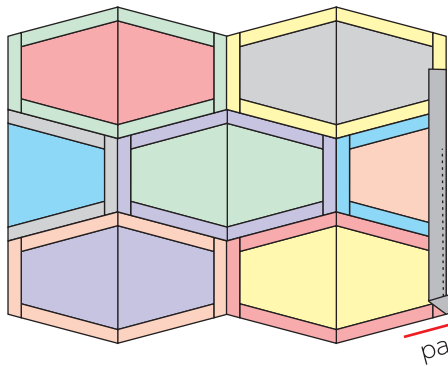
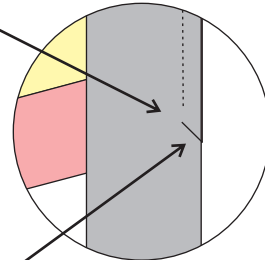


Binding Granny Dot

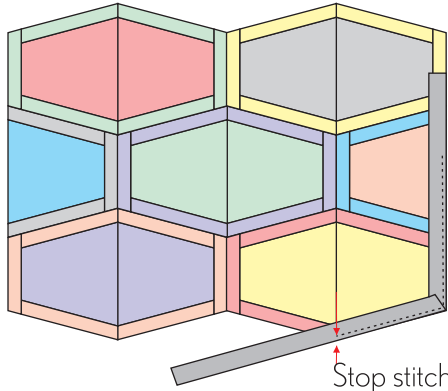


Step 1:
Start stitching on a long edge.
Stop stitching 1/4" away from bottom edge.
Pivot needle and stitch a fold line to point of corner.

Stop stitching 1/4" from bottom.
Pivot and stitch to corner.

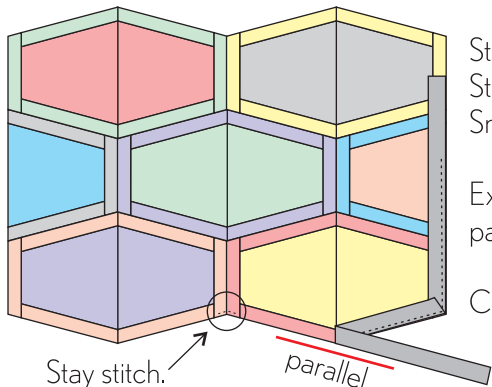


Step 2:
Fold binding back on fold line.
extend until parallel with the next edge you will be stitching.



Step 3:
Fold binding forward and line up with the next edge.
Stitch binding to quilt top.
Stop stitching at the seam in the center of a pair of tumblers.

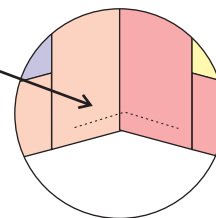
Stop stitching at seam.



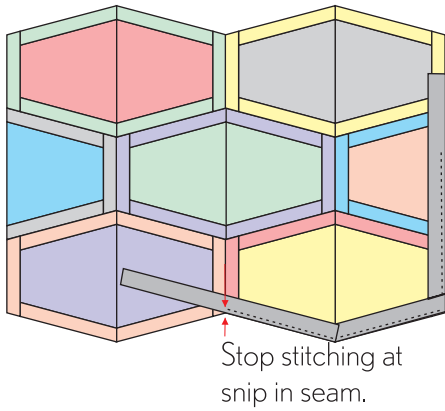
Step 4:
Stay stitch at inside seams 1/4" from edge to strengthen.
Snip to stay stitching.

Extend binding behind needle
parallel with the next edge.

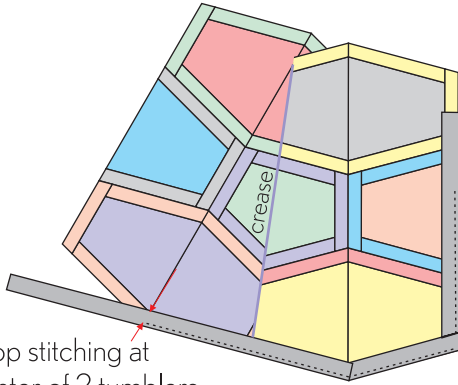


Stay stitch.
Snip to stay stitching.



Step 5:
 Fold binding back over and line up with the next edge.
 The fold should crease at the end of the previous stitching.
 This will create a little extra binding fold at the corner.
 This extra will allow you to create a miter on the front side
 when you hand stitch it down.

Stitch binding to quilt top.
 Stop stitching at the seam in the center of a pair of tumblers

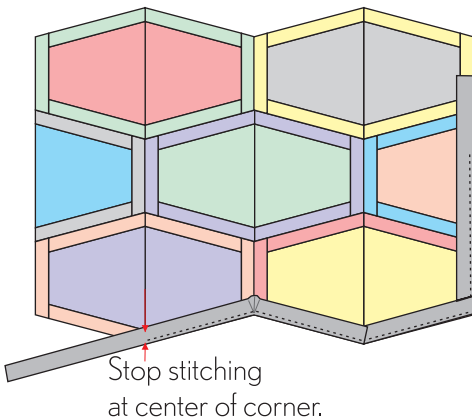


Stop stitching at
 center of 2 tumblers.

Step 6:
 For an inside corner the quilt needs to be straightened
 so the binding can be sewn on a straight line.

With the needle down at the center of the inside corner
 (where you stopped stitching in the last step)
 pull the quilt so the seam is parallel behind of and in front of the needle.
 Line up the binding along the seam and stitch.
 You will end up creasing the quilt.
 In the end, there will be extra binding at the inside corner for the miter.

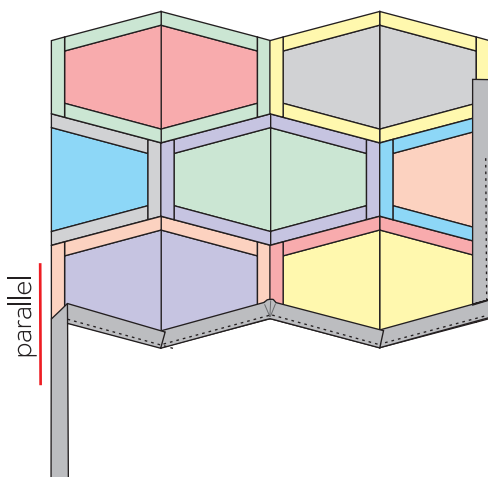
Stitch binding to quilt top.
 Stop stitching at the seam in the center of a pair of matching tumblers.



Stop stitching
 at center of corner.

Step 7:
 Fold binding back over and line up with the next edge.
 The fold should crease at the end of the previous stitching.
 This will create a little extra binding fold at the corner.
 This extra will allow you to create a miter on the front side
 when you hand stitch it down.

Stitch binding to quilt top.
 Stop stitching at the seam in the center of a pair of tumblers



Repeat technique for all tumblers across the bottom of the quilt.

Repeat the technique from Step 2 for the final corner at the bottom left edge.

Stitch the long straight edge and then repeat the steps to bind the other
 non-90° corners.
